

Enter If You Dare!

The scariest monsters of the silver screen will greet your guests.

What you'll need

- Masking and duct tapes
- Big marker
- Full sheet label paper (available at any office supply store)
- Scissors
- Antique chain
- Rubber snakes and bats
- Spider or cobweb fibers

Optional: Halloween lights, cornstalks, pumpkins, seasonal flowers, and spooky Halloween tape

What to do

- 1 Print 8"x 10" monster photos at your local Fujifilm photo kiosk, or print at home on 8 1/2"x 11" Fujifilm photo paper. Use circles of low-tack masking tape to attach them to your door.
- 2 Use a big marker to write a sound or saying for each monster on a full sheet of label paper (available at any store that sells office supplies). Draw a cartoon bubble around the lettering, then cut out, and peel off the paper backing. Lightly adhere to the door as shown.
- 3 String an antique-look chain from the door knocker to the door handle.
- 4 Insert rubber snakes into the chain links and suspend rubber bats from other links.
- 5 Spread "spider web" or "cobweb" fibers over a corner of the door using small pieces of masking tape to secure ends to the side edges and underside of door so they are not visible. Use a small piece of rolled-up duct tape to attach a fake spider to the web.
- 6 Create ambience around the door with Halloween lights, cornstalks, plus seasonal flowers and pumpkins, either fresh or artificial.
- 7 Play a tape of spooky Halloween noises whenever you're expecting company or trick-or-treaters at your door.

Trick-or-treaters will know they can expect a devilish surprise when they knock on your door!
