

Terror-ific Games for Halloween!

Create monstrously fun games for kids of all ages.

What you'll need

- Halloween photos
- Brightly colored fabric
- 9 yards of craft ribbon
- Spray adhesive
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Paper fasteners
- Yellow sticky-back foam sheets
- Chunky felt-tipped marker
- Dowel, rake or broom

What to do

- 1 Print 8" x 10" versions of your favorite Halloween photos.
- 2 Purchase 1 1/2 yards of brightly colored fabric, either a cotton Halloween print, or felt, or burlap. Lay the fabric with the longer edges running vertically. Fold the top 6" to the back, and stitch or glue the edge to form a rod casing for inserting a dowel, rake, or broom. Hem, fringe or trim off the bottom so the remaining fabric is square.
- 3 From 9 yards of wide craft ribbon in a contrast color cut eight 40" strips. Lay on newspaper and spray with spray adhesive. Wait a few minutes until glue is tacky to the touch, then adhere to the fabric background, with 4 strips running horizontally, and 4 vertically, forming a large tic-tac-toe grid with outlines all around.
- 4 Add your prints securely. Using a hole punch make a hole in each corner of each print. Using spray adhesive, glue a print to each square. Insert paper fasteners through punched holes and fabric, and spread open the shanks of the paper fasteners on the back of the fabric.
- 5 From yellow, sticky-back foam sheets, cut four 4" circles (moons) and five 6" stars. With a chunky felt-tip marker, mark assorted number scores in the centers. Peel off the paper backing and adhere a moon or star in each square.

Ready, Aim, Fire Game

Hang game surface on a wall, or lay it on the ground. Give the littlest players an advantage, letting them stand a yard away, with bigger kids standing 3 or 4 yards away, and adults taking their places from down the block, or in the next town. Each person gets 2 or 3 tries to toss Nerf balls, ping-pong balls, Whiffle balls, or balled up tissue paper at the game surface. Everyone's a winner, with a little trick-or-treat candy rewarded for every 10 points accumulated.

Terror-ific Tic-Tac-Toe Game

Spread the game surface on the ground or a table. Two players play tic-tac-toe, using mini-pumpkins and small gourds as playing pieces.

Variations on familiar games create kid pleasing games for Halloween parties!
